OVERALL PROJECT **OBJECTIVES**

- O1: enhance the researcher's methodological and project management capabilities via 'training through research' and consultation with EUI faculty, thus producing new knowledge.
- O2: improve the researcher's understanding of party competition, franchise and citizenship and contribute to the development of Europe-based study thereof.
- O3: to reach professional maturity by publishing research outputs, conference participation, dissemination and invited activities.
- O4: to establish durable collaborations with colleagues from the EUI and elsewhere with the aim of applying for major research funding in the coming years.









SPECIFIC RESEARCH OBJECTIVE

- Study the transformations of citizenship and voting rights in the post-Yugoslav states
 - Contextualize developments against party competition that takes place in a space shaped by intersecting continuums between nation-building and Europeanisation
 - Timeframe: 2000 2012 (extended to present!)







METHODS

- Mixed methods (complementary: quantitative and qualitative)
- Quantitative
 - S1: Coding of citizenship and the franchise legislation (EUDO)
 - S2: Construction of a bi-dimensional space (NB/EU) coding: progress in accession, NB Oslo survey
 - S3: Measuring the institutionalisation of party systems in the post-Yugoslav space (closure, fragmentation, volatility, polarisation)
- Qualitative
 - S1: conceptual and contextual sources (primary and secondary)
 - S2: Interviews with stakeholders (in all of the countries) EUI Ethics **Review Committee**
 - S3: Triangulation
